There's Your Trouble

So, there I am sitting while the mechanic looks over my car. Finally, he allows me to approach. Looking into the bowels of the engine, he points and says, "There's your trouble." He straightens up and begins preaching. "Now, Stan, your car is like a person. You have a relationship with your car. And you have to take care of that relationship so this little burgundy baby won't let you down." And I retort, "Jimmy, it's not a person. It's only a car, oh, and, by the way, I take care of my car." And he retorts back, "ONLY a car and you take care of it? And why is it here with me?" As I retreat, I swear I can see my car sneering at me.

But Jimmy had caught me. I really take my car for granted. I don't give it the attention it deserves. And that's why I'm sitting in Jimmy's garage, with a two-year-old "Guns and Me" magazine.

Perhaps, we take relationships for granted like our relationship with our family. It's easy to let go of the loving things we need to do with them. Those loving actions are so important. They are expressions of our love for our families.

What about our church? Shouldn't we invest in our relationship with our church? Share our love with the people? Work together, shoulder to shoulder as faithful disciples? Care about the church and what goes on in the body of Christ? *The Apostle Paul said that Christ was the head of the church, his body.* And the danger here is that if we began backing off investing in our relationship with our church, it becomes easy to back off investing in our relationship with our Lord. People sometimes act as if Jesus is supposed to do all the work in this relationship with us, and we just sit back and enjoy. But a relationship means that two people/parties are investing in and caring about each other. Christ always shows His love first, but it's important that we respond in kind, with our expressions of love toward Jesus.

Talking to a person about the importance of Christ's church in our lives, she said, "Stan, it's ONLY a church."
